

Town Manager Report - November 2021

The Storm water construction project has finally been completed. There is still paperwork and payments being processed for this project in the next couple of months. The entire grant will be closed out sometime in January 2022.

The new Town of Penney Farms Museum is open and the Historical Society had a preview and soft opening on November 30th. Residents were granted access to the museum and its contents and there was a nice turn out. A grand opening will be planned in early 2022.

The tennis courts have been totally pressure washed and cleaned for use. This is the time of year there is more activity on the courts, due to the cooler weather. New caution when wet signs have been put on the entrance gates for all participants to be aware the court surface is slippery when wet.

More water meters have been calibrated to ensure the equipment is still functioning properly. There was a water line break on Caroline Blvd. near the Arts and Crafts building that was repaired.

The VIPS (Volunteer in Police Services) volunteers had their training class at the Town Hall this month, which was hosted by the Town. Anyone interested in joining this program, please see the Town Clerk for more information.
